A NOTE FROM YOUR PASTOR

NEW DIOCESAN BISHOP

We have a new bishop! On Tuesday, October 3, the Holy Father announced at Roman noon that Bishop Edward Weisenburger is the new bishop of Tucson. It was very exciting to be at Saint Augustine Cathedral in Tucson at 7:00 a.m. as Bishop Weisenburger was introduced to the diocese.

Our (now) retired Bishop Gerald Kicanas knows our new bishop who has been serving the people of the Diocese of Salina in Kansas. He told us that there will be very unhappy Kansans when they hear the news. They know Bishop Weisenburger as a shepherd who loves his flock.

Our new bishop made a short address in which he expressed his excitement to minister here. He stated that he has been blessed in working as pastor and bishop with the people while collaborating with lay professionals, religious sisters, priests, and deacons. Later that morning, I heard him paraphrase Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta at the press conference. "I try to recognize the face of Jesus in every person I meet, no matter how well He is disguised." He made a point to tell the reporters that the Church values human life. He noted that our failure to treasure all human life is the origin of much of the world's suffering today. In this, I think he gives us a wonderful encouragement during this Respect Life Month. He said, "...a renewed appreciation for the Sanctity of all human life is, in my firm opinion, the only way we will reverse so many of our culture's wounds."

Bishop Weisenburger will formally begin his episcopal ministry here on November 29. Pope Francis has appointed Bishop Kicanas as Diocesan Administrator for these weeks before our new bishop takes charge.

Please join me in praying for our new bishop. We should also pray for our brothers and sisters in Salina who will begin their wait for a new bishop. And God bless Bishop Kicanas with good health and holiness in his retirement.
